Junior District Convention will be April 14at Union Academy in Monroe, NC. More information will be sent out.


We are all looking forward to a great year. Please remember communication is the key. "Aah, the places you will go in Junior Civitan."



NCDW Convention opened up with a warm welcome from our Master of Ceremonies and Governor, Donna Jackson. Bruce Sheeks. The weekend was filled with fellowship, good food and recognition with awards and speeches to individuals, groups and clubs. This meeting is the time of endings and beginnings. Donna Jackson passed the gavel to our Governor for 2018 Woody Weddington. Cathy Jones passed the District Governor Banner onto the Rockwell Club and the Govern Elect Banner was passed from Rockwell to the Richfield Club. It will be offered in print for one year upon request and after the one year, it will become each club's responsibility to print and distribute to members that have no access to a computer. At the present time, District Policy requires a minimum publication and postage of 8 pages published 4 times a year. Electronic distribution of the "Western Tarheel" would lift this set number of pages and issues. All articles will have the potential to be entered for news and articles that have been modified for space in the past will now have more leeway.
